### From Your Pastor:

*These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world, you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world. (John 16:33, NKJV)*

How often in our lives do we face difficulty and trial? How often do we live in defeat rather than in victory? Consider what the great Reformer, **Martin Luther**, wrote about the above passage:

“We should learn to remind ourselves of Christ’s victory. In Christ, we already have everything that we need. We only live to spread this message of victory to other people. With our word and example, we tell them about the victory that Christ secured for us and gave to us. Christ, our victor, accomplished everything. We don’t need to add anything to it. We don’t need to wipe away our own sins, or try to conquer death and the devil. Everything has already been done for us. We’re not fighting the real battle. We’re only suffering now in order to share in Christ’s victory. It’s not accomplished by what we do....

We know from the past when believers were severely tested, the Holy Spirit reminded them of Christ’s victory and strengthened them so they could endure everything. They could even face martyrdom, relying on Christ’s victory. May God help us also to hold on to Christ’s victory during our troubles and when we’re dying. Even though we don’t understand these words of Christ completely, we can still believe in them in times of trouble and reassure ourselves.”

As we consider what Christ is in our lives and what he has done on our behalf, let each one of us be strengthened and encouraged to continue to face this world. And in the process, let each of us be challenged to share the hope we have in Christ with all those around us.
